#### SO CLOSE!

#### Randy Prier, DTM, District Goals Monitor

We are now well into the new Toastmaster year and progressing nicely on our club and district goals for 2010-11.

But first, a brief look back is in order. We all should congratulate District 24's 13 President's Distinguished, 10 Select Distinguished, and 5 Distinguished Clubs for 2009-10. Those 28 Distinguished or better clubs represented 42% of our baseline total of clubs (66) for the year. That's a higher percentage than we've had in recent memory. However, as good as that was, we could have been even better. Last year we had 10 clubs that were within 2 members and/or 2 goals of achieving Distinguished status. One additional club was within 3 members and 1 goal of being Distinguished. SO CLOSE!!

To break it down even further, 6 of those 11 clubs met the membership qualification but were just 1 or 2 goals short. Only one or two additional CCs, ACs, CLs, or ALs would have put them over the top. One other club accomplished all the goals they needed, but missed the membership qualification by just two members. Three other clubs were either one or two members and one goal short. SO CLOSE!!

Had all 11 of those clubs qualified for Distinguished, we would have had almost 58% of our clubs Distinguished or better for the year. That's the kind of number that the Top 12 Districts in the world achieved last year! SO CLOSE!!

Now, without knowing the individual circumstances of all those "so close" clubs, we can't say how many of them were really trying hard, but came up just short. If that was your situation, congratulations for your hard work and better luck this year. However, the whole purpose for this article is to alert those clubs that may not have realized how close they were and how just a little more effort—one or two more new members or one or two more educational awards—might have gotten them to Distinguished. If that was your situation, make sure you stay on top of your status, and make that little extra effort required this year to bring you the recognition you deserve.

Being Distinguished is not just about "Brownie" points; it's the measurement of performance and standard of excellence that we expect from all Toastmasters clubs!
